

## Physical Education and Sport Premium Impact Statement 2020/21

The Sports Premium has been allocated to schools to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport at primary school; it is also to be used to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1-6.

Victoria Road was allocated £17,710 for the academic year 2020-2021, which we received in two separate allowances in October and April.

We are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality of PE and we recognise the health and well-being of all of the pupils at our school. We believe that a varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have positive influences on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of children.

## **Impact Statement**

Throughout **2020-2021** PE funding continued to have a significant impact enhancing the breadth and quality of sport.

This year's funding was spent on the following:

- GetSet4PE Planning Purchased
- Storage for PE equipment
- PE equipment
- Additional swimming lessons for Year 6
