

Physical Education and Sport Premium Impact Statement Overview 2022/23

The Sports Premium has been allocated to schools to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport at primary school; it is also to be used to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1-6.

Victoria Road was allocated £17,900 for the academic year 2022-2023, which we received in two separate allowances in October and April.

We are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality of PE and we recognise the health and well-being of all of the pupils at our school. We believe that a varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have positive influences on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of children.

Overview of spending

Throughout **2022-2023** PE funding continued to have a significant impact enhancing the breadth and quality of sport.

This year's funding was spent on the following:

- Specialist coaches to upskill staff through effective CPD
- PE Equipment
- Additional swimming lessons for Year 6
- Climbing and Physical Outdoor Equipment for EYFS
- Soft Play flooring for EYFS outdoor area
- Tracksuits for Y1 -Y6
- Access to Halton SGO and School Games Mark application
- Orienteering Course on school grounds and training
